SCHOOLS

We are presently in the midst of a ten-year initiative to show God's love to students and their families connected to all ten public elementary school in Camarillo. There are thousands of children and their families that experience financial struggles. Through your generosity, we have been able to provide assistance in the form of school supplies, clothing, groceries, and utility and repair bills. In addition, we provided Christmas gifts for over 300 families this year. More than 1,000 families have been served at Pleasant Valley School of Engineering and Arts (PVSEA), Las Posas, Dos Caminos, Rancho Rosal, and Tierra Linda Schools.

GOOD NEWS CLUBS (GNC)

A weekly after-school group for interested students, who receive permission from their parent(s) or guardian(s), to learn a Bible lesson, provide hope, build character, and strengthen moral and spiritual growth. This is a great evangelistic effort among students. Prior to the pandemic, GNC were in place at PVSEA, Dos Caminos, Cam Heights and Rancho Rosal Schools. These were attended by fifty students at each campus. This year we arranged to re-launch at all existing campuses and add GNC at Las Posas and Tierra Linda Schools. We are prepared to start six GNC in Camarillo.





NEIGHBORHOOD GROUPS

Our Vision is to saturate our community with gospel-centered small groups that we call, Neighborhood Groups (NG). NG area a great place to grow as disciples who love God supremely, love neighbors as themselves, and seek to make other disciples who do likewise.

Prior to the pandemic, during the height of restrictions, and as the pandemic has lingered, we have discovered how important small groups are to spiritual and emotional health that flows from being a mature follower of Jesus. Presently, there are about 65 groups meeting throughout our community. Some meet in person, some online, and some use a hybrid. Groups are connected by geographic proximity, life stage, affinity, or a special interest. The true nexus, or connection, is an interest in growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Love the Bible

We learn the Bible in our Sunday gatherings as we study verse by verse, paragraph by paragraph, and chapter by chapter through books of the Bible. This year we studied the Gospel of Mark for ten months and also explored Habakkuk. We look forward to learning Philippians and Acts together.

Follow Jesus

We yearn to make Jesus king in every realm of our lives and make other disciples who do likewise. We spent weeks this year learning what it means to be followers of Jesus who love God supremely, love neighbors as self, and make other disciples who do likewise.





Go Together

We enjoy life in community with other followers of Jesus. Even though the pandemic created challenges to gathering, we have sought to live this value and overcome the challenges by forging community on Sunday mornings and in Neighborhood Groups during the week.

Create Margin

We seek to ensure that our church calendar maintains margin for time with family and neighbors as well as time with God. Nevertheless, we gathered together for Summer Nights of Worship, Youth Camp, Welcome Celebrations, Fall Festival, and Nights of Prayer.



GLOBAL MISSIONS + CHURCH PLANTING

We have partnered with Bible-teaching, church-planting churches on six continents. In 2020 we supported twenty (20) different ministries and missionaries, nine of whom were part of Calvary Nexus before going to serve in their mission field. Through your support, we were able to invest over \$100,000 to support global missions.

Patrick Ijaka of New Covenant Missions, a Ugandan pastor, began his ministry among the previously unengaged Mening people. There are now more than nine hundred believers among a reached people group of eight thousand (more than 10%). A remarkable work of God is taking place, a church is established, and more than fifty believers were baptized.

We have continued to support church plants with our neighbors in Mexico and began a church planting initiative in Chandigarh, the capital of the northern Indian state of Punjab.
